

CORRECTION TO EARLIER UPDATE of today at 2:15

Tactical or back burns may be scheduled along the forest's edge in the foothills community as a defensive tactic against the Station Fire. "Just because we say there is a scheduled back burn does not mean it will happen," said Los Angeles County Fire Inspector Eduardo Osorio. The weather and fire conditions have to be a perfect combination before firefighters deem it safe to begin a tactical fire.

Because nerves are still on edge due to the fires that have traveled down the mountain the past week, residents along the foothill communities are keeping an even more watchful eye on their neighborhood.

Osorio said he does not want residents to panic or worry if they see flames in areas along the forest line, especially areas community members have thought had already burned. It is all in the department's continued effort to make certain homes and residents are safe.

No evacuations are planned for the area.
